

# SORTING ACTIVITIES



Sorting activities can range from super simple to more complex and is an important skill for your child to learn. It also keeps little hands and bodies busy, which is always a plus! Using objects in your home as teaching tools makes the learning more meaningful for your child and makes for easy set up. Here a few sorting activities to try:

## COLOUR SORTING

Start simple with a few features, like sorting red and blue objects, then move to sorting red, blue and yellow. Continue to add more colors to sort.

### Toys and Objects

Use small toys and objects and a sorting tray of any type.



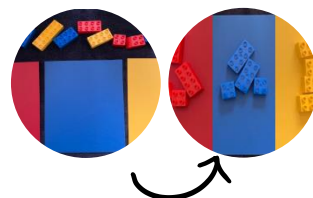
### Cups and Crayons

This is a simple activity for color sorting using plastic cups and crayons.



### Lego Blocks

Color sort lego or duplo blocks. Once the blocks are sorted then build color towers!



## SORTING OBJECTS

Find everyday objects around the house, like keys, buttons, and paper clips.



## SORT BY SIZE AND SHAPE

You can also try using a muffin tray to hold all the sorted items!



## SORTING while doing "CHORES"

Make helping around the house fun! Make it into a "sorting game" by having your child help with sorting things like clean laundry, silverware, groceries and even toys.

This also provides lots of opportunities to label things around the house. Use action words like "open" and "shut". Talk about where things are using locations words. Use describing words of shape, color and size.
